W.E.B. DuBois wrote the passage above because he disagreed strongly with Booker T. Washington. How does DuBois make his argument that Booker's approach is wrong? Use information from the passage to support your explanation.

1. Identify R.A.C.E.S. in each passage

DuBois make his argument that Booker's approach is wrong because Du Bois asks that black people give up, at least for the present, three things first, political power; second, insistence on civil rights; third, higher education of Negro youth. Also, Mr. Washington's doctrine has tended to make the whites, North and South, shift the burden of the negro problem to the Negro's shoulders and stand aside as critical spectators.

DuBois made his argument that Booker's approach is wrong by pointing out how Mr. Washington wants to status quo, and no faith in our culture. The things Mr. Washington said were in a way degrading which gave whites the way to feel as if nothing really changed. For an example, in the passage "Excerpt from The Souls of Black Folk" by W.E. D. DuBois it reads "Mr. Washington's doctrine has tended to make the whites, - and stand aside as critical spectators;" According to that Mr. Washington was just becoming a black man trying on a white's racist shoes. Since Mr. Washington was very powerful man with an audience he felt he was on their side the whites. For instance Mr. Washington states "Cast down your bucket where you are" - cast it down in making friends with the southern white man." Through this quote I know that Mr. Washington
